Special Standing Rules (proposed)

- 1. A delegate wishing to address the convention should electronically enter the appropriate queue, and, when recognized by the chair, state his or her name. The delegate shall also state the name of the circuit and region or administrative unit (e.g. board, commission, committee) he or she represents.
- 2. A three-minute limitation shall be applied to all who speak 'from the floor'.
- 3. Business of the special convention shall be limited to that which arises from the overture submitted by the Board of Directors and shall come before the convention for a decision only through the appropriate resolutions committee (Synodical Bylaw 2.19 f).
- 4. The whereas sections shall be considered an integral part of a resolution and any action pertaining to the resolution applies to all its parts.
- 5. If substitute motions are offered, they shall be handled according to Robert's Rules of Order.
- 6. Unless covered by these Standing Rules of the convention; parliamentary procedures shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised, latest edition.

A Primer of Parliamentary Procedure

- A. Purpose of Parliamentary Law and Procedure
 The purpose of parliamentary procedure is to
 carry out the aims of the assembly in an
 orderly and fair manner, to expedite business,
 to insure justice and fairness to all, both the
 majority and the minority. It is not the purpose
 of parliamentary procedure to make the
 conduct of business in an assembly difficult,
 or to entangle an assembly in technicalities, or
 to provide a channel for individuals to flaunt
 their parliamentary knowledge.
- B. Basic Steps of Parliamentary Procedure
 The chairman and members of the assembly should be acquainted with and observe eight basic, essential parliamentary steps to take care of convention business in an orderly and fair manner.

They are:

Members:

- 1. Address the Chair, "Mr. Chairman" (or "Mr. President".)
- 2. Await recognition by the Chair.
- 3. Make the motion, "I move that...."
- 4. Second the motion. (Unless not required.)

Chair:

- 5. States the motion. (Or rules it out of order.)
- 6. Calls for discussion. (Unless motion is undebatable.)
 - "Is there any discussion?" or "Are there any remarks?" Ample opportunity must always be given for expression of opinion and discussion.
- 7. Takes the vote. (Or "Puts the question.")
 A 2/3 majority vote is required to adopt changes to Statutory Bylaws according to Statutory Bylaw 20.01.
- 8. States the results.

The motion is carried, or, the motion is lost. The vote does not go into effect until the results are announced.

Basic Parliamentary Principles for Synod Convention

- 1. All voting delegates have equal rights, privileges, and obligations.
- 2. The will of a Synod convention is determined by the taking of a vote.
- 4. Free discussion of the resolution presented for decision is an established right for all delegates, voting and advisory. The convention has the right to decide when it has heard sufficient discussion. This right, however, should be exercised with restraint.
- 5. Both proponents and opponents of a given proposal have rights which must be safeguarded. The decision belongs to the majority, but the right to discuss, the right to be heard, and the right to oppose should be upheld.
- 6. The simplest and most direct parliamentary procedure for accomplishing a purpose would be followed rather than taking devious routes, multiplying technicalities.

TO AMEND STATUTORY BYLAW 9.01 OF THE 2017 HANDBOOK OF LUTHERAN CHURCH-CANADA

1 2 3 4	WHEREAS	the wisdom or even the possibility of holding an in-person Convention of Lutheran Church–Canada, scheduled for June of 2021, is in jeopardy and questionable as a result of continued uncertainties surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic; and
5 6 7 8 9	WHEREAS	the purpose of holding a Convention is not simply for conducting business – elections to various offices and positions, making amendments to the Handbook, taking action on overtures and reports, etc. – but also an opportunity to physically gather together as contemplated in Synodical Bylaw 2.01: "The Convention shall afford an opportunity for worship, nurture, inspiration, fellowship, and the communication of vital information"; and
11 12 13 14 15	WHEREAS	changing the June 2021 Convention from an in-person to a virtual or online Convention would result in pastor and lay delegates being unable to physically gather together for a period of eight years; and
16 17 18 19	WHEREAS	the Board of Directors has, through an overwhelming majority, voted in favour of postponing the June 2021 Convention for one year with terms of office of all elected or appointed positions being automatically extended until then in accordance with provisions of Statutory Bylaw 10.03 and Synodical Bylaw 2.61; and
20 21 22	WHEREAS	postponing the June 2021 Convention to 2022 requires a change to Statutory Bylaw 9.01 of the 2017 Handbook of LCC; therefore be it
23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30	RESOLVED	that Statutory Bylaw 9.01, as it currently reads: "A Convention shall be held every four years at a time and place determined by the Board" be amended to read: "A Convention shall be held every four years at a time and place determined by the Board. The Convention may, however, be postponed due to extraordinary events (acts of God, war, terrorism, government regulations, disaster, strikes, civil disorder, pandemic, etc.). In such a case, the Convention is to be held as soon as feasibly possible."

Rulings of the Commission on Constitution Matters and Structure

CCMS Meeting - June 20, 2020

Moved and seconded that it is possible to conduct a 2021 Convention electronically according to CCMS interpretation of LCC Bylaws. The motion was carried.

CCMS Meeting - July 9, 2020

In discussions the CCMS indicated in order to hold a LCC convention in 2022, a special convention would need to be held for the purpose of changing Statutory bylaw 9.01.

CCMS Meeting - July 9, 2020

Moved and seconded that the Special Convention voting delegates will consist of delegates who attended the 2017 LCC Convention who are still in force at this time and if such a delegate cannot represent the circuit, the circuit alternate delegate to the 2017 LCC Convention will be the replacement; where both are unavailable the circuit will choose a new replacement. The motion was carried.

CCMS Meeting - July 9, 2020

Moved and seconded that the Special Convention Advisory delegates will consist of Pastoral and Diaconal delegates who attended the 2017 LCC Convention. The motion was carried.

CCMS Meeting - July 9, 2020

The CCMS ruled that Term limits of elected and appointed positions that would end in 2021 can be extended until that individual's successor takes office as per Statutory bylaw 10.01a and Synodical bylaw 2.61b.

Special Convention Bulletin #1 July 16, 2020

WHO?

- 1. Circuit Delegates to the 2017 LCC Convention are the delegates to this Special Convention, as per the interpretation by the Commission on Constitution Matters and Structure (CCMS) of Statutory Bylaw 9.13 in the 2017 Handbook of Lutheran Church—Canada: "Those eligible to attend and vote at a Special Convention shall be those delegates in office at the time of the preceding Convention except those delegates who have been disqualified by termination of membership in the Member Congregation which they represent." In case pastor delegates are no longer serving in the circuit or lay delegates are no longer members of a circuit congregation, the alternate delegate from the circuit is to attend. In some cases where no pastor or lay delegates or alternates from the 2017 LCC Convention are available, a Circuit Convocation will need to be held in order to elect such delegates. If such is the case, each congregation is to be represented at the Circuit Convocation by its pastor and one lay member designated by the congregation (Synodical Bylaw 4.41 b).
- Advisory delegates to the Special Convention are the presidents of our seminaries, and, as per the
 motion adopted by the CCMS, the pastor and deacon advisory delegates from the 2017 LCC Convention.
 Again, if such pastor or deacon advisory delegates are not available, alternates will need to be appointed
 or elected.
- 3. Current members of the Board of Directors of LCC and the Commission on Constitution Matters and Structure, as well as the executive staff of LCC, are to attend this Special Convention.
- 4. Guests or visitors who desire to watch the proceedings may also attend.

WHAT?

To approve an amendment to Statutory Bylaw 9.01 ("A convention shall be held every four years at a time and place determined by the Board.") that would allow the Board of Directors to change the time of the convention due to unusual circumstances. See the attached overture from the Board on this matter. Comments on the overture may be submitted to the Secretary at convention@lutheranchuch.ca who will forward them to the convention Resolutions Committee that will appointed by the Synod President. The Resolutions Committee itself will be the entity presenting the resolution concerning changing Statutory Bylaw 9.01 to the convention delegates for their decision.

WHERE?

In light of the ruling of the Commission on Constitution Matters and Structure that the 2017 Handbook of LCC does not prohibit a convention being conducted by electronic means, nor would such contravene applicable government regulations; this Special Convention will be a virtual or online convention. Details will be sent to all delegates and individuals mentioned above as they become available.
