


SURVEY REPORT | PASTORS RESPOND

Congregation and Church Worker Future Planning

Lutheran Church-Canada pastors and congregational leaders participated in a survey in the winter of 2024. The surveys were sent out by the President's Ministry Council on behalf of our synod and seminaries. This survey report serves as a tool for our synodical, seminary, and congregational leaders by providing a better understanding of the issues facing our congregations—so we can work together to address the concerns of our synodical family.






QUESTION: If you plan to retire in the next 5 years or less, how do you see yourself serving after retirement? (Select all that apply)

QUESTION: If your parish would not be in a position to call a new pastor, is there at least one layman who might be called upon to lead worship?




ANSWERED: 103

ANSWERED: 102


QUESTION: If there is such a layman, would he be open to taking classes from the Seminary via distance education to be better equipped for this service?

Thematic Summary of Comments

This following summarizes the responses provided by pastors in the 2024 Future Planning Survey. Comments are organized thematically for each of the key questions.

QUESTION: What unique challenges does your parish face?

DEMOGRAPHIC CHALLENGES

Aging congregations, youth disengagement, and declining attendance.

Many noted few or no young families.

"An aging congregation with no younger families."

INTERNAL DYNAMICS

Leadership shortages, divisions, difficulty in cooperation.

 Many noted internal conflicts or leadership gaps.

"Division in goals among the congregation."

FINANCIAL CONSTRAINTS

Budget shortfalls, inability to afford even pastoral salaries, building upkeep issues.

· Many rely on part-time pastors.

"Paying for a full-time pastor uses almost all of our resources."

OUTREACH & EVANGELISM

Difficulty connecting with community, and cultural change.

• Many mentioned challenges in outreach or immigrant integration.

"The world has come here... we need training in intercultural outreach."

GEOGRAPHIC & STRUCTURAL BARRIERS

Challenges of multi-point and rural/remote parishes, lack of church buildings.

- · Geographic isolation.
- · Several rent space for worship.

"150 km between points. It's difficult to provide pastoral care."

Thematic Summary of Comments Cont'd

QUESTION: What unique challenges does your part of the country face?

COST OF LIVING & HOUSING

High housing prices and cost of living limit church and community sustainability.

"High housing prices, both renting and purchasing are a major issue in my area."

SECULARISM & SOCIAL SHIFTS

Decline of religious interest, rise in spiritual confusion.

"There is a general apathy regarding church, faith and God."

GEOGRAPHIC ISOLATION

Rural settings and vast distances between congregations.

"6.5 hours' drive to the nearest LCC church."

QUESTION: What challenges do you see Canadian society in general facing?

MORAL & SPIRITUAL DECLINE

Secularization, erosion of Christian values, and confusion in identity.

- Many comments reflected this.
- Topics include LGBTQ+, euthanasia, abortion, and post-truth culture.

"We live in a post-Christian society... we are afraid to offend."

ECONOMIC & SOCIAL INSTABILITY

Rising cost of living, housing crises, economic disparity.

"Cost of living is putting stress on families and spiritual needs are on the back burner."

CULTURAL POLARIZATION & DIVISION

Increased political and ideological polarization.

"Ongoing fracturing, chaos, disunity."

Thematic Summary of Comments Cont'd

QUESTION: What challenges do you see LCC in general facing?

DECLINING MEMBERSHIP & AGING DEMOGRAPHICS

Shrinking congregations and aging members.

"Shrinking churches, shortage of pastors."

LACK OF OUTREACH & ADAPTATION

Disconnect between leadership and congregations, cultural engagement challenges.

 Many called for better communication and adaptability.

"Disconnect of leadership with people in congregations... need to fund new ministries."

PASTORAL SHORTAGES & SEMINARY CONCERNS

Not enough pastors, concerns about having two seminaries.

"Two seminaries for our size seems unsustainable."

Thematic Summary of Comments Cont'd

QUESTION: What ministry aptitude and skills for church work are most needed in your context?

RELATIONAL & COMMUNICATION SKILLS

Emphasis on empathy, listening, connecting with members.

- Many responses mentioned communication or people skills.
- "Ability to connect and communicate with rural people."
- "Someone who shares our Lord's love for people."

FLEXIBILITY, ADAPTABILITY & INNOVATION

Ability to serve multiple points, adapt to change, and lead creatively.

"Flexibility, stamina, leadership, direction, vision."

"Willing to sacrifice and work hard."

FAITHFULNESS TO DOCTRINE & PASTORAL INTEGRITY

Commitment to Scripture, Lutheran Confessions, servant leadership.

• Many responses emphasized faithfulness and integrity.

"Faithfulness to the Word and a heart to care for souls."

"Firmly planted in the Word of God."

PREACHING, TEACHING & THEOLOGICAL DEPTH

Strong biblical teaching, clear preaching, and doctrinal knowledge.

- Many comments referenced these competencies.
- "Preaching, teaching, a winsome attitude." "Strong and sound biblical preaching and teaching."

OUTREACH & EVANGELISM FOCUS

Aptitude for reaching the unchurched, evangelism, and mission-mindedness.

"Evangelism and outreach with newcomers."
"A missionary heart and aptitude."

USE OF TECHNOLOGY & MODERN TOOLS

Comfort with digital platforms, streaming, and tech use in ministry.

"Use technology to keep the points connected."
